Don't assume that your home is safe.
Here are just a few poisons to look for:

LAUNDRY AREA

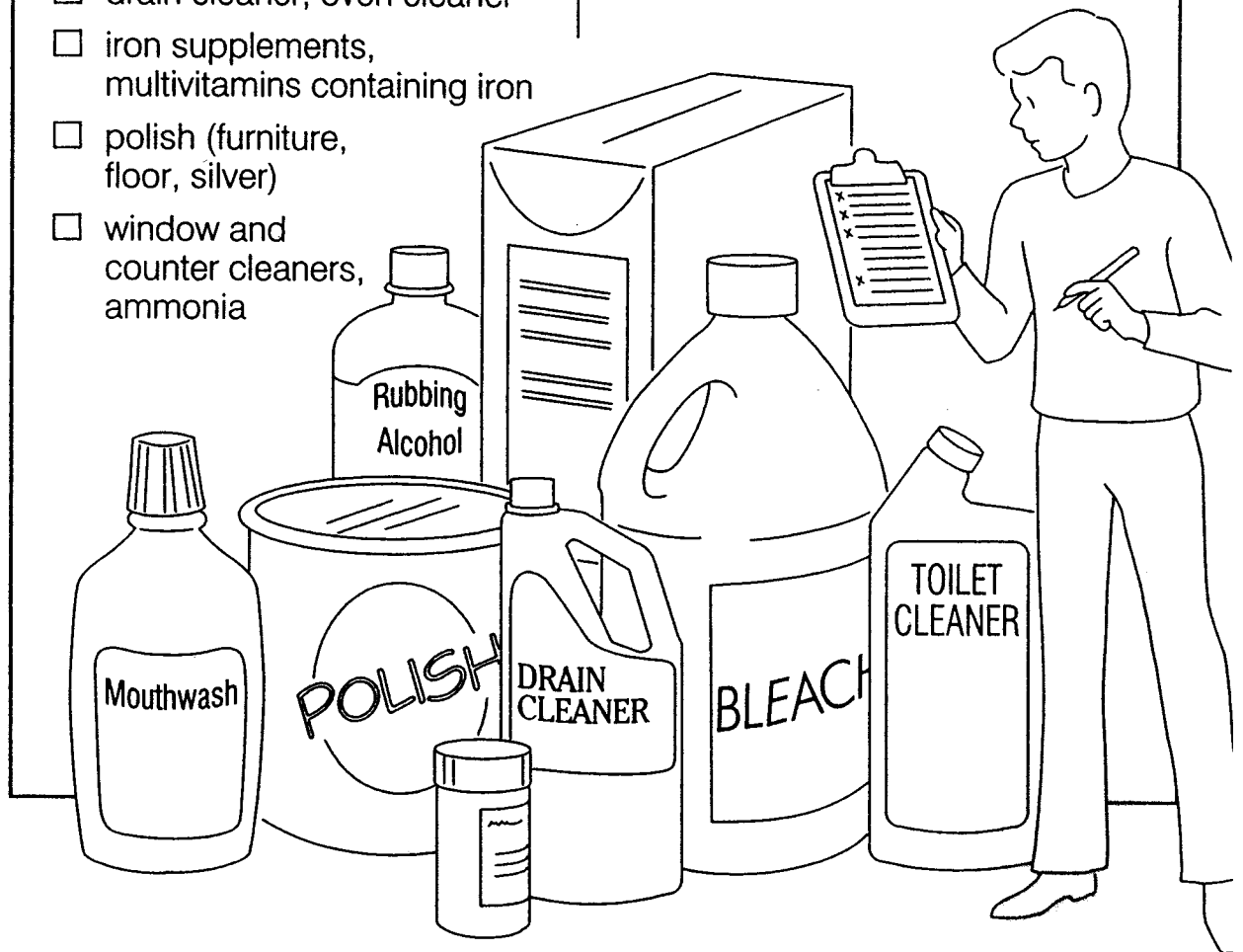
- detergents, soaps
- dyes
- bleach, bluing agents
- fabric-care products
- stain or spot removers

KITCHEN

- detergents, dishwasher products
- drain cleaner, oven cleaner
- iron supplements, multivitamins containing iron
- polish (furniture, floor, silver)
- window and counter cleaners, ammonia

BATHROOMS

- medicines (prescription and over-the-counter)
- cosmetics, hair-care products
- mouthwash, fluoride mouthrinse
- rubbing alcohol
- disinfectants, toilet bowl cleansers, etc.



BEDROOMS

- medicines
- perfume, cologne, aftershave
- cosmetics
- sprays (hair, deodorant, etc.)

GARAGE/OUTSIDE STORAGE

- car products (motor oil, antifreeze, etc.)
- garden products (herbicides, pesticides, etc.)
- gasoline, kerosene
- paints, thinners, solvents
- pool supplies (such as chlorine)

BASEMENT/ATTIC

- hobby and craft supplies
- ink, glue, other adhesives
- insect traps, rat poison, etc.

THROUGHOUT YOUR HOME

- alcohol, tobacco
- mothballs
- plants
- sources of lead (paint chips, toys, some plastic miniblinds, etc.)
